COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Administration/Community Association: Written report on file with the Village Clerk

Parks/Public Works:

1). NYSEG is expected to finish installing new gas lines to all the homes on Kinney Street by COB Thursday, August 13th. SuitKote will then mill the street, as well as Phelps St. Broome Bituminous is ready to pave when the milling is done. All parties know the project must be completed before the start of school on September 8 or 9.

This year's mandated concrete ADA curb cuts were on Kinney, Elizabeth, and Phelps and cost \$18,000. The paving portion this year will be around \$20,600 for Kinney and Phelps and the milling around \$4,800. About 2/3rds of that paving and milling cost will come from the Millennium Pipeline account and, therefore, not be charged to Village residents.

- 2). Hillcrest Rotary has been very kind to the Village, again. Their Board authorized a total of \$2,707 to be spent for playground and safety equipment in the Park. The final quotes from the manufacturers have been received and delivery is expected in about 3 weeks. Village Board authorization is requested tonight for the actual purchasing of the items, with reimbursement by Rotary to follow. The total cost of the items to be purchased, with a shipping cost estimate, is around \$3,000. The Village Park budget will make up the difference between the Rotary donation and the actual delivered cost.
- 3). Discussions have been held with our Village Attorney regarding cost estimates to establish a tax deductible organization for the purpose of collecting funds to build a Band Stand in the Park. It is anticipated the fund raising project will take several years, with completion before the Village's Sesquicentennial in 2016. Cost estimates are still being collected---prefabricated oval-shaped structures in the 12' x 20' range with interior and exterior lighting, sound systems, railings, front steps, and ADA-compliant ramp cost upwards of \$35-40,000 when you include the foundation. Most of the prefab units come from Pennsylvania. I am also checking with local homegrown builders to see what they would charge for a stick built version.
- 4). A special "Thank You" to our resident and neighbor Paul Kallfelz, Sr. who volunteered his time on several days to help the volunteer painters paint <u>every</u> fire hydrant in the Village, except the 4 that had been recently done by the school. Paul kept painting until he ran out of paint---doing about 30 of them. Thank You Paul.
- 5). The Village is working with the Town in preparation for the celebration of the Town's 125th Birthday. An event will be held in Otsiningo Park on Saturday, Sept. 17, 2016. Several meetings have been held regarding budgeting, entertainment, food service, birthday cake issues, etc. Any Village involvement that might require funding will be discussed at the next Work Session.
- 6). Routine matters continue, such as catch basin cleanouts, lawn mowing, dead tree (and soon to be dead tree) removal, 18 "No Parking on the Grass" signs were ordered July 17th and should be in soon, etc.
- 7). I would like to acknowledge a very special recent award received by our own Bill Parker. Bill and his family recently traveled to New York City to attend a special banquet in Manhattan, where he, along with *The Today Show* weatherman Al Roker and a few others, received beautiful awards and induction into the New York State Broadcasters Hall of Fame. Bill is the first person ever from the Southern Tier to receive such an award, and we congratulate him for it.

The Port Dickinson Fire Department responded to 12 calls in the month of July These calls are broken down as follows, 4 fire calls and 8 medical assistance calls. 6 calls in the Village, 5 calls in the Town of Dickinson and 1 call in the city of Binghamton.

The Fire Department also offered 6 hours of training (8.5 present 52.5 man hours)

The Port Dickinson Police Department received 117 Complaints, they assisted other agencies 2 times, they issued 5 parking tickets and 13 Traffic tickets.


