The Port Dickinson Police Department responded to 117 calls for assistance, gave mutual aid 3 tImes, they wrote 11 Traffic Tickets 20 Parking tickets.

The Fire Department responded to 14 calls for assistance 6 fire calls and 8 medical emergency calls, we received mutual aid 4 times gave it 8 times we had 8 calls in the Village, 5 in the town of Dickinson and 1 call in the town of Fenton.

Fire Department year ending 2017, responded to 160 calls for assistance, 82 Fire Calls and 78 EMS calls. Those calls are Broken down as 103 calls in the Village 44 in the Town of Dickinson, 10 calls in the Town of Fenton, 2 calls in the City of Binghamton and 1 call in Chenango County (Search and rescue).
