The Special Meeting was called to order at 5:00 pm.

- 1. Presentation by Andy Cocina, Wendel Companies regarding energy audits and remote access water meters.
- Motion by Trustee Aagre seconded by Trustee Felo, for a Resolution accepting the Tentative Budget for 2012-2013 AYE TRUSTEES AAGRE, CASHMAN, DEGENNARO, FELO NAY NONE

Budget discussion: contractual expenses were reduced for most departments by at least 10% with approximately \$90,000 coming from the fund balance. The budget includes \$10,000 toward the purchase of a new dump truck and \$7,000 toward the purchase of a new police car.

- 3. Gregory Ave there is a beaver dam along the highway which has formed a 1-2 acre pool of water. Andy Massar, DOT, has agreed to remove the dam once the Village has relocated the beavers. A wildlife specialist will be called.
- 4. The Mayor reported that people are parking between the curb and sidewalk which may create problems with water shut-offs. Possible solutions to be discussed at the 4/24/12 work session.
- 5. NYCOM is reporting that they are pushing to amend the tax cap for emergency expenditures. This will assist municipalities with the 25% portion of loss that FEMA does not cover.
- 6. Trustee Aagre reported that the emergency repairs to the Wayne Ave pump station are estimated around \$30,000. Joe Rosati will no longer be able to replace the 1972 generator. Formal estimates should be received soon.
- 7. Trustee Aagre presented information on a new billing method for water/sewer that would include an operational cost per household and a charge for actual water/sewer use. This method would eliminate the current minimum usage of 5,000cf/yr. This will be discussed at the 4/24/12 work session.
- 8. Trustee Cashman requested review of the Personnel Policy with regard to vacation. It was proposed to amend the vacation policy to 25 days after 10 years of service for non-police employees and five weeks vacation, equating to 10 days off for Police Officers, after 25 years.

Motion by Trustee Felo seconded by Trustee DeGennaro to adjourn at 6:00 pm.
